To build a foundation of faith Jesus offers us these words

- 1.I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. John 13.34-35
- 2. "One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Mark 12.28-31
- 3."But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first. Matthew 19.30
- 4."It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served and to give his life as a ransom for many." Matthew 20.26-27
- + Luke 22.24-27 "A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. But Jesus said to them, "The kings of the gentiles lord it over them, and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather, the greatest among you must become like the youngest and the leader like one who serves. For who is greater, the

one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

- 5. Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing
- "For if you forgive others their trespasses your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." Matthew 6.14
- "Then Peter came and said to Jesus, Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times? Jesus said to him, Not seven times, but I tell you seventy-seven times." Matthew 18.21
- 6. Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You who are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels, for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink; I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life." Matthew 25.41-46

- 8"Do not believe that I have come to abolish the law but to fulfill. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill." Matthew 5.17 "BUT I say to you....

 Matthew 5.22 "You have heard that it was said You shall love your neighbor and haste your enemy but I say to you....."

- 10. "Listen and understand: It is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person but it is what comes out of the mouth that defiles." Matthew 15.10
- 11. Then Jesus' mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." And Jesus replied. Who are my mother and my brothers? And looking at those who

sat around him, Jesus said, said "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."
