## Celebrating an Anniversary - Let Our History Guide Us

Anniversary Sunday provides an opportunity for us all to consider how Mt. Zion has withstood troubling events throughout its history.

Most of us weren't around then, but our history dates to 1856 when a group known as The Finksburg Congregation made plans for a church building. The men of the community, with their own hands, faith and prayer, built a small church on a plot of land across the street from where we are now, and the Finksburg Methodist-Protestant Church was founded. If you look at the bell tower as you leave today, you can see the engraving memorializing its beginning.

Just 5 years later and before the building's completion, our nation was engaged in the Civil War. Maryland was home to sympathizers on each side, and I assume that Finksburg was no different. However, the church remained strong and grew, and a new, larger church building was constructed where we are now. The war claimed the lives of as many as 750,000, but with faith and prayer, Mt. Zion endured.

In 1917, World War I had already been raging for 3 years when the US entered the fighting. Men from all over the country were drafted into service, but with faith and prayer, Mt. Zion endured.

Then in 1939, this country was thrown into the Great Depression. Many of you do remember that. Excessive government borrowing and bank failures led to the high unemployment, inflation and homelessness that plagued our nation. The Finksburg community was not immune, but with faith and prayer, Mt. Zion endured.

President Franklin Roosevelt famously said, "December 7, 1941, a date which will live in infamy...." The lives of Americans everywhere were forever changed when Pearl Harbor was bombed, and America was thrown into World War II. Over 12,000,000 American military personnel served. 88 of the dead were from right here in Carroll County. Women were raising families alone and taking the places of men in fields and factories. No one escaped the hardship, but with faith and prayer, Mt. Zion endured.

This faith community suffered through the "police action" in Korea, the war in Viet Nam and the Gulf War, yet with faith and prayer, Mt. Zion endures.

The Covid pandemic caused many churches to suspend weekly services for a time and led to the permanent loss of church attendees in parishes everywhere. Mt. Zion was no different. Some no longer join us because they cannot attend services in person anymore. A few passed away, and for some, they prefer the convenience of watching the weekly video from the comfort of their homes. Fortunately, Mt. Zion still endures.

And as is often the case, each crisis brought the congregation of Mt. Zion closer and stronger. In its 167-year history, we have celebrated, and we have seen crises, yet as a church, a family of believers, we have grown stronger. I hope that we can continue to flourish long into the future.

The Mount Zion United Methodist Church Council at their meeting on Tuesday, March 21, 2023 reaffirmed what had been agreed upon at a previous meeting that our church will remained as part of the United Methodist Church denomination.
