Interesting that the Hampstead police did not know of a motel in their area. He said his "boss" could pick him up on Thursday morning and take him to work.

Your support of our Community Service Fund helped him with safe lodging and something to eat. Although we keep information confidential through the years, we have had many incidents like this one. God is still working. Working through faithful followers of Jesus.

Let me close with a prayer request. Lift up your prayers for the City of Baltimore, for the Mayor and those in leadership and especially for those who are angry and frustrated and take out their pain on others. Not just the city but in the suburbs and even in rural areas where far too often violence against one another is occurring.
