Our Journey of Faith

Celebrating the Wind, the Breath & the Pentecost-Power of God

In the Genesis story of creation (1.2) the "wind" of the Creator (in Hebrew "ruah" –spirit) blew over the waters. Words like "**Breathe on me, breath of God, fill me with life anew**" are found in Edwin Hatch's power hymn. African-American writer James Weldon Johnson in his sermon in

verse wrote words like - then the Great God breathed into the lump of clay and blew into it the breath of life!

Following the resurrection of Jesus, the disciples were filled with unconquerable joy but confused as to what they should do next. That question was answered on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2) – "Suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind and it filled the entire house where they were sitting."

That "Wind" — that "Breath" — that "Spirit" — radically changed their lives. Their resurrection faith was translated into every-day resurrection lives.

I still believe that the "wind/ruah" of God still blows.

I would affirm with my "amen" the words of the hymn by Daniel Iverson: "Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on me. Melt me, mold me, fill me, use me, Spirit of the living God fall afresh on me!"

The Spirit of Pentecost is the Spirit of the living Jesus who said "Lo, I am with you always even to the end of the world" (Matthew 28.20).

The "Gift of the Holy Spirit" (which we celebrate on Sunday, May 28) is more than an important day on the Christian church calendar.

It is the call, even the command of Jesus "to go into the world but not be of the world!"

It is a reminder of what we often say at the close of our Sunday worship service "when you leave this place and go into the world do not leave your faith behind you!"

My closing words "breathe on your people O God, breathe on us the breath of life."

MOUNT ZION TO REMAIN A UNITED METHODIST CONGREGATION

The Mount Zion United Methodist Church Council at their meeting on Tuesday, March 21, 2023, reaffirmed what had been agreed upon at a previous meeting — that **our church will remain as part of the United Methodist Church denomination**.

There has been a lot of discussion among United Methodist congregations on whether to stay in the denomination or leave the denomination and join another Methodist group or go independent. It was felt at this time we need to stay in the denomination while at the same time learning more about related issues that are being discussed. We feel that the General Conference of the United Methodist Church being held in the fall of 2024 should give us some guidelines.

THE BUSY BEES ARE VERY BUSY!

You may not know that one of the groups who use our social hall is called the Busy Bees. Our own **Lois Pulket** is one of the Bees and helps coordinate the meetings and projects. The Bees are a group of women who like to teach each other quilting methods, techniques, and patterns. But, they're also buzzing around doing charitable projects that are both local and worldwide in scope, including their commitment to bring canned goods to each meeting to help fill our Goat.

The group meets on the second Friday of each month. It was on one of those days I happened to stop by to drop something at the church. It also happened to be the day that the Bees were busy putting together boxes of goodies for **military personnel** stationed overseas. The boxes were filled with donated toiletries, candy, and home-baked cookies. The Bees had also raised the funds needed to mail the boxes to our soldiers, and our Mission Fund assisted with that effort.

Another of their projects is making quilts and blankets for **Project Linus**, which gives these blankets to hospitalized children. They recently sent 75 blankets for distribution to children in Africa. Members of the group also made the wall hangings for our sanctuary that we saw in the Fall/Thanksgiving.

But the project that melted my heart is the **t-shirt dresses**. These dresses are styled using a t-shirt with material added to the bottom as a skirt. A pocket is added to each dress and stuffed with a pair of underwear. These dresses are sent to Haiti, where they are distributed to young girls who have no clothes. The dresses help to protect these girls from sexual assault.

So, while these ladies are sewing and creating for their own use, they are also on a mission to sting like bees at helping others. I'd like to see Mt. Zion jump in to help them. Do you have **unused fabric** lying around from sewing or craft projects that you aren't going to use? Can you purchase a package of **girl's underwear** (toddler to adult sizes)? How about a package of **t-shirts**? Any kind will do, no need to be fancy.

This is a chance for us to assist one of our own who is involved with another mission project. If you can help with material, t-shirts, or underwear, please see Lois or bring it here to the hive (the Goat). They also accept cash donations to pay postage or buy things they need for community projects. I know that any help that we as a congregation can give will be appreciated by the group.

As Proverbs 3:17 says: Do not withhold good from those who deserve it, when it is in your power to act. And here at Mt. Zion, we have shown that power over and over again. Let's continue!
