We can always do certain things to keep our own identity and still do things that have made you fall in love with your church. For example, if music was something that you loved about your church we can still keep that alive. One way we can do this, and something that is simple and small but can add a huge impact to our worship, would be singing some of your favorite hymns whether old or new before service as a hymn sing. Maybe bringing more times of fellowship back to the church. This




# An Attitude of Gratitude!

# THANKSGIVING TRIVIA QUIZ-ANSWERS

- 1.B. Cornbread Colonists did not have access to wheat flour, so there were no crusts for traditional Thanksgiving pies. Cranberries wouldn't be served as sauce for another 50 years, and candied yams appeared in 1889.
- **2.D. Santa Claus** The annual Thanksgiving spectacular began in 1924 and didn't include its trademark balloons until 1927.
- **3.C.** Wampanoag The Wampanoag lived on land which now constitutes parts of Rhode Island and Massachusetts.
- **4.B. Abraham Lincoln** Shortly after a hard-fought victory at the Battle of Gettysburg, Lincoln declared the last Thursday in November to be set aside as a day of thanksgiving.
- 5. False Tryptophan can make a person sleepy, but this does not happen when combined with other amino acids, of which turkey has plenty. More likely the culprit is simply overconsuming rich foods, which redirects blood flow away from the brain to the stomach.
- 6.C. Made it earlier in the year Thanksgiving had traditionally been celebrated on the last Thursday of November. In 1939 that happened to be the last day of the month, curtailing the Christmas shopping season during the tail end of the Great Depression. FDR moved Thanksgiving to be a week earlier. After two years Congress set the holiday as the fourth Thursday.
- 7.A. Canada Canadian Thanksgiving dates back to 1578, when explorer Martin Frobisher held a celebration in Nunavut to give thanks for the safety of his fleet. Today it's held on the second Monday in October.
- **8.B. Detroit Lions** New team owner George A. Richards came up with the idea for his team to play on the holiday to boost awareness and ticket sales. It worked. The Lions played to a sellout crowd and have continued the tradition every year since, except for a pause between 1939 and 1944.
